#### **CONCERT 1 CHARLES-RICHARD HAMELIN**



**SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 25, 2022** 3 pm, Vancouver Playhouse

We start off our anniversary season with the return of Charles Richard-Hamelin, the first Canadian silver medalist at the 2010 International Chopin Competition.

Since that eventful year, Hamelin has gone from strength to strength, with both concerto and recital appearances in major musical centres, as well as award-winning recordings. In the 2021-2022 season, he made his long-awaited appearance with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra in a ravishing performance of Chopin's 1st piano concerto.

In the recording studio, he continues his complete cycle of Beethoven's violin sonatas with Andrew Wan, concertmaster of the Montreal Symphony Orchestra. For his recording of Chopin's two piano concerti with Kent Nagano and the Montreal Symphony, *Gramophone* magazine writes, "His playing never sounds routine or exhibitionistic...Chopin's bravura passagework is imbued with meaning...High flown fioritura seems informed by what a great singer could accomplish." He has also made distinguished recordings of Chopin's Preludes, Impromptus, and Ballades, as well as the Sonata No. 3 in B minor, all for the Analekta label.

Join us for what will surely be a concert you will always remember, by Canada's own poet of the piano.

A Vancouver debut by one of today's most musically dynamic and technically gifted young pianists.

Born in Kiev, Ukraine, Kholodenko was winner as well as audience favourite at the 2013 Van Cliburn Competition. Since then, he has collaborated with some of today's great conductors and orchestras, and has given recitals in New York, Lucerne, Paris, and other major musical centres. He is a frequent guest at today's most prestigious music festivals, including the Chopin and His Europe Festival, the Grange de Meslay Festival, and the International Keyboard Odyssiad and Festival (USA).

A prolific recording artist, Kholodenko records for the Harmonia Mundi label. His recording of the Grieg concerto and Saint-Saens' Piano Concerto No. 2 was awarded "Editor's Choice" by *Gramophone*. His most recent recording of solo works by Scriabin received a Diapason d'Or de l'année. In a review of his performance of Prokofiev's 5<sup>th</sup> piano concerto, a critic writes, "What a knockout!" Another review describes how he "unleashes technical prowess and immersive lyrical engagement".

We promised to bring her back, and here she is!

When Zlata Chochieva made her Vancouver debut in November of 2019, audience members were both stunned and moved by her playing of Chopin and Rachmaninoff. Geoffrey Newman of Vancouver Classical Music named her recital one of Vancouver's three best classical music event of the season.

Her recent recording of transcriptions by Rachmaninoff, Liszt and Friedman was universally praised for the originality of its concept as well as her stunning pianism, and was nominated for both the Opus Klassik Award and Shallplattenkritik Award. Her recording of Chopin's Etudes was selected as an Editor's Choice by *Gramophone*, and was also named as one of the 10 greatest Chopin recordings.

She is a resident of Berlin, where she continues her very active concert and recording career. She most recently made her long-awaited debut in Singapore, where she again moved audience in the historic Victoria Concert Hall with the poetry and beauty of her playing.

If you attended her debut recital in Vancouver, we know you would want to experience her music-making again. If you missed that incredible concert, you are in for an indelible musical experience!

In 1980, a relatively unknown pianist from Vietnam stunned the musical world by winning the gold medal at the 10th International Chopin Competition in Warsaw. Since that eventful year, Dang Thai Son has become much sought after as recitalist, concerto soloist, competition adjudicator, as well as master teacher. His students include some of today's most notable pianist, including Bruce Liu, Kate Liu, Eric Lu, and Charles Richard-Hamelin. Dang Thai Son has performed under the direction of conductors such as Sir Neville Marriner, Vladimir Ashkenazy, Pinchas Zukerman, and Ivan Fischer. Since winning the Chopin Competition, he has maintained a close connection with Poland. In 2005, he was the only guest artist at the Opening Gala of the 15th International Chopin Competition. In 2018, Poland's Ministry of Culture awarded him the Gloria Arts Gold Medal for Merit to Culture. A prolific recording artist with an extended discography, Dang Thai Son has recorded for Deutsche Grammophon, Melodiya, Polskie Nagrania Muza, SONY, Analekta, Victor JVC, as well as for the Fryderyk Chopin Institute. Don't miss the first appearance under the auspices of The Vancouver Chopin Society of one of today's most revered artists.

During the pandemic, we presented a short online performance by Tomasz Ritter, winner of the 1<sup>st</sup> International Chopin Competition on Period Instruments in 2018. We are overjoyed that Tomasz will finally be making his debut in Vancouver this season.

Regarding his performance at that competition, Witold Paprocki writes, "Ritter's performance draws attention to the deliberate, consistent concept of interpretation and the ability to use the display of virtuosity to highlight the music's expressive qualities." Of his performance of Chopin's 1st piano concerto, veteran critic Michael Moran writes, "So many levels of expression were present here, some bordering on the divine." The same writer comments on Ritter's performance of Chopin's Op. 33 Mazurkas: "His pauses were eloquent and emotionally charged. There were heartbreaking moments at the conclusion of this (B minor) mazurka."

Although equally comfortable with the modern piano, Ritter has been involved with early instruments since the age of 12. He is already a veteran of the concert stage, having performed extensively throughout the music world. In 2014, he released his first album featuring works by Bach, Beethoven, Szymanowski, and Ginastera for the Polskie Nagrania Muza label.

We thank Suzie LeBlanc and our friends at Early Music Vancouver for the loan of their beautiful 1819 Conrad Graf piano on which Ritter will perform, built by master instrument builder Paul McNulty.

#### **CONCERT 6 KYOHEI SORITA**



The artistic find of the 18th International Chopin Competition, Kyohei Sorita's playing at the competition touched the hearts of the Varsovian audience, and caught the ears of the discerning jury members, with his heartfelt and mature interpretations. He was awarded the silver medal, the highest prize for a Japanese-born pianist since Mitsuko Uchida's second prize in 1970.

Since his outstanding performance in Warsaw, Sorita has been extremely busy, performing both in his native Japan and internationally. Anna Debowska, writing for the Gazeta Wyborcza, praised his performance of Chopin's 1st piano concerto as being the highlight of the competition: "The ripe found kept changing its colour, shape and weight." From another writer covering the same event: "...one pianist...whose musical maturity, imagination, poetry, and technical prowess have fused seamlessly to blissful proportion. His name if Kyohei Sorita."

A conductor as well as pianist, Sorita founded the Japan National Orchestra in 2019, a 17-member chamber orchestra.

Varsovian Szymanowski is best known for his iconic statue of Chopin in Warsaw's Łazienki Park.



This beautiful bust is now close to completion, and will be shipped to Vancouver very soon. It will find a home in the lobby space of the Vancouver Academy of Music. The official unveiling of the bust will take place on Monday, September 26, 2022 at 7 pm.

The Vancouver Chopin Society will be hosting a fundraising event in conjunction with the unveiling.

Charles Richard-Hamelin, Canada's own silver medalist at the 2015 International Chopin Competition, will play a short recital before the unveiling of the sculpture. The ceremony will be followed by a reception.

We hope that you will be able to join us for this joyful event, when this beautiful work of art will find a home to be enjoyed by all.
